Information for Health Care Professionals

Heartburn is a frequent problem for many people as more than 60 million Americans suffer from its discomfort at least once a month.¹ In recent years, its prevalence has also increased in younger populations between the ages of 18 and 45.² Contributing factors include stress, overeating, eating too quickly, eating large meals before lying down, and consuming a high-fat diet.

For relief of occasional heartburn, **Acidil**[®] specifically targets the three main associated symptoms: **production of gas** from fermentation due to slow digestion, **stomachaches** from acidity or cramps, and **heartburn** due to acid reflux.

Acidil has no known drug interactions. It is not known to slow down the absorption of other medicines or micronutrients. It does not contain antihistamines, which can reduce the body's release of the acid needed for digestion, thereby slowing down digestion and causing side effects such as gas and drowsiness. Patients feeling bloating will appreciate not having to drink water with Acidil's meltaway sublingual tablets and pellets.
